123	VILLAGE MARKET DAY: The Clerk was instructed to write to Mrs Edwards, Secretary of the Market Day Committee with regard to arrangements for this year's market.
124	FERE MERE WEED PROBLEM: The recent weather has made it impossible for the weed-clearing plans to commence. This matter will be reviewed when weather permits.
125	NOTIFICATION OF ACCIDENTS: Two accidents have recently occurred on the village roads: - At the village crossroads on Thursday 28 th January, two cars collided; - At the bottom of Tagg Lane near the old toll house, a car collided into a dry-stone wall. No personal injuries were reported.
126	RIGHTS OF WAY MINOR MAINTENANCE SCHEME: Members agreed to consider any further work needed to maintain the footpaths in the current grant year.
127	DOG WASTE ON PAVEMENTS: The Council has received many complaints with regard to this. The state of the pavements have been particularly bad recently, people evidently not clearing up their dog's excrement and leaving it for people to tread in. Cllr Mrs Frost, who is also an assistant at the school, reported that this has proved a considerable problem when walking with the children to and from the village hall. Dog excrement has had to be cleaned off the children's shoes on numerous occasions. The Clerk was instructed to write a notice for display on the village notice board drawing people's attention to this problem and asking for dog-owner's co-operation in this matter.
