88	APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE: Cllr Chris Palfreyman; Dist. Cllr David Frederickson; County Cllr Simon Spencer
89	DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST: None
90	MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING: The Minutes of the meeting held on 5 th September 2011 and 18 th July 2011 were approved as a correct record.
91 91.1	<p>PLANNING MATTERS: <i>Applications for consideration:</i></p> <p>91.1.1 <u>Bay Horse Barn, Chapel Street</u>: Installation of one CCTV camera, for Mr Ivor Delafield The Parish Council have no objections to this proposal.</p> <p>91.1.2 <u>The Croft, Church Street</u>: Change of use of land and erection of stable block with integral tack room and store, for Mr Stephen Wake The planning consent for previous application NP/DDD/0407/0363 dated 03.05.07 made provision for three parking spaces which have never materialised. The stable block development will result in no provision for parking space for any vehicle, especially a horsebox. We are therefore concerned where vehicles will park. Before The Parish Council make a decision we would like further information with regard to the parking of vehicles and a horsebox. The proposed building will be within the new proposed conservation area, which the PDNPA have considered vitally important to keep because of the medieval strip fields surrounding the linear village. We are concerned this will extend the built up area of Monyash and it will lose some of it's linear character.</p> <p>91.1.3 <u>The Croft, Church Street</u>: Erection of garden office, for Mr Stephen Wake As in the other current planning application NP/DDD/1011/1060 at the same property, we are concerned with regard to the provision for parking as under previous consent none has been provided for the main house. We feel the proposed building is out of character for it's proposed use but would have no objections to a simpler barn style building with no chimney.</p>

92.3	<i>Budget 2012/13.</i> Estimates for financial requirements need to be submitted by January 2012. The Clerk was instructed to supply accounts for the next meeting, to assist in Budget planning.
93	RENOVATION OF SCHOOL PLAYING FIELD: Awaiting fencing quote. Cllr Leach will liaise with Cllr Woolley with regard to surfacing required. Cllr Mrs Scoggins will liaise with the proprietors of the property adjacent to the field with regard to their views on the fencing and work to the field.
94	PROPOSED VILLAGE TOILET CLOSURE: Dist Cllr Frederickson has liaised with Peter Foley, Director of Community Services at DDDC with regard to this matter. Mr Foley has indicated he is willing to attend a Parish Council meeting to discuss further. The Clerk was instructed to invite him to December's meeting.
95	STREETLIGHTING AT BOTTOM OF RAKES ROAD: It has been noted that the new lighting at the bottom of Rakes Road is considerably dim. The Clerk has reported this to the department responsible for streetlighting at DCC yet no improvement has been noted. The Clerk will pursue this matter.
96	SHRUBBERY ON JACK MERE CAR PARK: Matter in hand.
97	RECYCLING AREA: The Clerk has reported this matter to the Waste Management Services Dept at DDDC by telephone. The Clerk was instructed to complain in writing to ensure the matter is dealt with.
98	VILLAGE NOTICE BOARD: Repairs to the notice board are in hand. It was requested that an additional key be cut for a member of the Parish Council to hold or the Public side of the notice board be left open for access.
99	REPAIR/CHANGES TO STONE STILE IN JACK MERE CAR PARK: A letter has been received from Lynn Burrow, PDNPA Area Ranger who feels that improvements to the stile need to be made and some fingerposts are needed to prevent people losing their way around the cottages at the end of Handley Lane. Cllr Mrs Frost will meet Lynn Burrow at the car park on Tuesday 15 November at 1.15pm to discuss this matter further.
100	SAFER NEIGHBOURHOOD POLICING ISSUES: A piece has been placed in the local Contact magazine to request volunteers for road safety training which will involve the use of a speed gun. Also, further to issues raised at the last meeting, a piece requesting residents not to park on pavements and in dangerous places also went in the magazine. Mrs Beverley Leach has reported the concerns re the flight path over Monyash to Air Traffic Control. Matter Completed.
101	AREA COMMUNITY FORUMS, TUESDAY 15 NOVEMBER AT AGRICULTURAL BUSINESS CENTRE, BAKEWELL: Date noted. Unfortunately no Parish Council Members are able to attend. The Clerk was instructed to request that any minutes be sent.
102	FERE MERE WEED PROBLEM: The Clerk has been contacted by Disley and New Mills Angling Club, who have fishing rights to the mere, with regard to the weed problem. They have solved the problem on another water they use by use of a piece of machinery called a Truxor and the use of Barley Straw. However, members feel this may not be appropriate for Fere Mere given the conservation issues. Cllr Mrs Scoggins will liaise with her contact on the PDNPA conservation team with regard to this.
103	DATES FOR PARISH COUNCIL MEETINGS 2012: The following dates were agreed: 6 February, 5 March, 2 April (Annual Parish Meeting), 14 May (Annual

104	INCIDENT AT CROSS LANES SATURDAY 5 NOVEMBER/SUNDAY 6 NOVEMBER: The Parish Council have received complaints with regard to an event apparently held by Matlock Motor Club during the night. An excessive number of vehicles were travelling at speed along Cross Lane and then down Blackwell Lane. This resulted in considerable noise disturbance. Furthermore, the damage and mess left along these lanes is unacceptable. The Clerk was instructed to report this matter to the police and write to Matlock Motor Club to complain.
105	SALT BIN: The Parish Council feel that an additional salt bin is required in the village preferably in close proximity to the notice board. Due to the fact that the pavements are not cleared, as people tread on the snow in the Winter it becomes impacted down to very hard and slippery ice. This is a considerable hazard to all, especially the elderly and schoolchildren who walk to and from the village hall each day. The Clerk was instructed to enquire whether a new salt bin is possible, to help alleviate the problem.
